## **Annual Report of the Examination Branch**

**2015-16**

The Annual report of the examination branch for the year 2015-16 of Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit, Kalady.

Dr Suchetha Nair continued her tenure as the Pro Vice Chancellor of the University during 2015-16. As per the Academic calendar, there was a smooth conduct of University Examinations and declaration of results during this year. The Examination calendar for the odd and even semesters of 2015-16 were published on 17.09.2015 & 23.03.2016 respectively.

The University has implemented Choice Based Credit and Semester system (CBCSS) for BA Degree courses from 2015 admission onwards and grades are published accordingly. This system is based on internal evaluation and external written examination. The components of internal evaluation for Under Graduate programmes are detailed below:

### **I. Admission, Course registration and Exam registration**

The University conducts admission to all PG courses through entrance examination and students were requested to apply online for the entrance examination with requisite fee. Hall ticket can be downloaded from the website. Admitted students are given id and password. Students should do the course registration within one month. Those who have done the course registration are permitted to register for the end semester examinations.



The examination schedule for online registration for the end semester examination are given 2-3 months before the commencement of examinations. Registration for examination is online and hall tickets are generated to eligible candidates. The time table for examinations are published one month before the commencement of examination and all the above mentioned details are timely uploaded in the website of the University.

## **II. Condonation of shortage of attendance**

Those students who have shortage of attendance can apply for condonation of shortage of attendance, in the prescribed format before 15 days from the commencement of examinations.

80% attendance is compulsory for writing the PG examinations. For BA & MPED courses 75% & 90% attendance respectively are compulsory.

## **III Internal Assessment**

Internal Assessment, including seminars, test papers and assignments are done in a time bound manner, and the marks/ grades are published in the notice board in the departments. After all the redressal of grievances, the grades are forwarded to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor.

## **IV Question paper setting and printing**

Three sets of question papers along with the answer keys in sealed covers are submitted to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor by the Heads of the Departments. The question papers for the examinations are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor randomly from among the three sets of question papers submitted. The examination 'A' section makes arrangement for printing and packing of question papers confidentially under the supervision of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. Blank Answer sheets with serial numbers are also sent to the





departments and 8 Regional centres, well in advance before the commencement of examination.

#### **V. Feedback Collection**

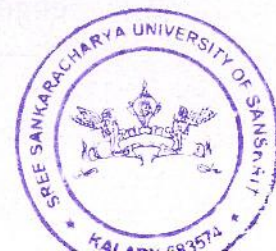
The students feedback on course, teachers and non teaching staff are collected through offline mode , prior to the conduct of Semester Examinations.

#### **VI Practical examinations**

According to the time table set by the respective Departments, the practical examinations are conducted before the theory examinations. The External examiners are appointed by the Pro-Vice Chancellor from the panel given by the concerned Heads of the Departments.

#### **VI Examination.**

The University shall notify the details such as date, time, and courses with code number etc., of the examination. And students shall register themselves for the examination. There shall be a University Level Examination for each course at the end of each semester. No student who is more than 30 minutes late shall be allowed to appear for the examination. No student will be allowed to leave the examination hall within 90 minutes after the commencement of the examination. If any student indulges in any malpractice like copying, consulting other students, etc., the invigilator shall enter his remarks on the answer paper under his signature. The Invigilator should take into custody of the answer book, the material used for malpractice, hall ticket and statement from the candidate. In such an eventuality the candidate shall not be allowed to complete the examination and shall be sent out of the hall. Before the candidate is allowed to leave the hall, a statement may be obtained from him and the invigilator shall report to the Head of the Department/Campus Director immediately with full details and remarks. After all the examinations are over,





University will collect the answer scripts and hand over to the concerned examination sections for the conduct of centralized valuation camp.

## **VII Evaluation**

Valuation of the PG &UG answer scripts were done by arranging a valuation camp immediately after the examination is over. The Deputy Registrar / Assistant Registrar—in-charge of the examination concerned will exercise overall control of the camp and shall be responsible for the proper conduct of valuation and maintenance of appropriate registers, records and accounts relating to the camp. The Head of the Department shall be the Chairman of the valuation camp. In the case of PG answer script valuation, the first valuation shall be done by the faculty who has handled the course and the second valuation shall be done by an external examiner. Internal and External evaluators are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the panel of experts submitted by the Head of the Department.

In the case of UG valuation camp, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall appoint a senior faculty member, preferably from the University, as Chairman of the Board of Examiners. The Valuation shall be done at a centralized valuation camp arranged by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor . The Chairman will be assisted by Chief Examiners and examiners to carry out the valuation work. One chief examiner will be appointed for every five examiners. If there are less than 5 examiners in a particular Board, the Chairman will act as the Chief Examiner.

## **VIII Publication of result**

During the year 2015-16, the results of UG and PG Programmes were published, subject to ratification by the Syndicate and Academic Council on 11.08.2016 & 29.07.2016 respectively. No moderation was given for any of the UG, PG , Diploma programmes except BFA. Grace marks are awarded to the eligible applicants for achievements in sports, youth festival, NCC and NSS.





Marklists and Provisional certificates are issued soon after the release of results. After the publication of results, UG students can apply for revaluation within one month. Revaluation results are also published within the stipulated time period prescribed in the UG regulations.

## **Annual Report of the Examination Branch**

**2016-17**

The Annual report of the examination branch for the year 2016-17 of Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit, Kalady.

During the midst of the Academic year 2016-17, Dr Suchetha Nair completed her tenure as the Pro Vice Chancellor of the University and relieved of her duties. Meanwhile Dr Dharmarajan P.K took charge as Pro Vice Chancellor w.e.f 15.12.2016. All the Examinations were conducted properly on the scheduled time strictly adhering to the rules and regulations specified in the Examination manual.

### **I. Preparation of Exam Schedule**

As per the academic calendar 2016-17, the examination schedules for the odd and even semesters were prepared and notified on 03.10.2016 & 13.03.2017 respectively.

### **II. Question paper setting and printing**

The Heads of the Departments submitted three sets of question papers along with the answer keys in sealed covers to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. Appointment of Question paper setters was made by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the respective panels submitted from the Departments and accordingly 3 sets of question papers are submitted to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor well in advance.

The question papers for the examinations are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor randomly from among the three sets of question papers submitted. The printing and packing of question papers are confidentially done under the



supervision of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. Answer sheets with serial numbers are also sent to the departments and 8 Regional centres, well in advance before the commencement of examination.

### III. Exam registration

The students to PG courses were admitted to the University through entrance examination and the admitted students are given specific id and password. Students did their course registration within one month after the admission. Those who have done the course registration were permitted to register for the end semester examinations.

The examination schedule for online registration for the end semester examination was given 2-3 months before the commencement of examinations. Registration for examination was through online process and hall tickets were generated to eligible candidates. The time table for examinations were published one month before the commencement of examination and all the above mentioned details are timely uploaded in the website of the University.

### IV. Condonation of shortage of attendance

Those students who have shortage of attendance was directed to apply for condonation of shortage of attendance, in the prescribed format before 15 days from the commencement of examinations.

## **V. Internal Assessment**

Internal Assessment are done in a time bound manner, and the marks/grades are published in the notice board in the departments. After all the redressal of grievances, the grades are forwarded to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor.

## **VI. Practical examinations**

The practical examinations were conducted before the theory examinations, according to the time table set by the respective departments. The external examiners are appointed by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the panel given by the concerned Heads of the Departments.

## **VII. Examination.**

The HODs/Directors are the Chief Superintendent at each Dept./Centre during the conduct of University examination and Additional Chief Superintendents are appointed and deputed to each Centre / Department from other Regional Centres / Departments and Main Center- Kalady by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. After all the examinations are over, University will collect the answer scripts and hand over to the concerned examination sections for the conduct of centralized valuation camp.

## **VIII. Feedback Collection and Analysis**

The feedback on courses, teachers and non teaching staff are collected from the students through offline mode and the same is analysed by the core feedback committee.

## **IX. Evaluation**

False numbers were stamped on the answer scripts to maintain secrecy. For U.G. programmes, single valuation was done and revaluation facility was given to students. For PG programmes, double valuation was done. The concerned Head of the Department or the senior most faculty



suggested by the Head of the Department was the chairman of the valuation for each subject. Internal and External evaluators are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the panel of experts submitted by the Head of the Department.

**X. Publication of result**

Results of various Programmes during the Acedemic Year 2016-17 were published, subject to ratification by the Syndicate and Academic Council. After the publication of results mark lists are issued at the earliest and provisional certificates are distributed on request in the prescribed format. After the publication of results, UG students can apply for revaluation within one month. Revaluation results are also published within the stipulated time period prescribed in the UG regulations.

**2017-18**

The Annual report of the examination branch for the year 2017-18 of Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit, Kalady.

Dr Dharmarajan P.K continued as the Pro Vice Chancellor of the University during 2017-18 until Prof (Dr) K.S. Ravikumar took charge as Pro Vice Chancellor w.e.f 29.01.2018. The conduct of University Examinations & related administrative procedures ,declaration of results and issuance of certificates were performed under the leadership of Prof (Dr) K.S. Ravikumar on time. The University conducted the examination process and student support through online mode and a dedicated IT team was deputed for the above said purpose.

### **I. Preparation of Exam Schedule**

The examination schedules for the year 2017-18 was prepared and notified on 16.09.2017 &28.03.2018 respectively.

### **II. Constitution of Board of Examiners**

Appointment of Question Paper Setters and Examiners from within the department relating to all Examinations, including Entrance Examination, conducted by the University was made by the Head of the Departments in the subject concerned. A scrutiny Board constituted by the Head of the Department scrutinizes the question papers. Every panel submitted by the Head of the Department concerned to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor consisted of sufficient number of paper setters or examiners for setting question paper for BFA as required.

### **III. Question paper setting and printing**

As soon as the examination schedules are notified, three sets of question papers along with the answer keys in sealed covers are submitted to the





Pro-Vice-Chancellor by the Heads of the Departments. Appointment of Question paper setters for BFA was made by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the respective panels submitted from the Departments and accordingly 3 sets of question papers are submitted to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor well in advance.

The question papers for the examinations are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor randomly from among the three sets of question papers submitted. The examination 'A' section makes arrangement for printing and packing of question papers confidentially under the supervision of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. Answer sheets with serial numbers are also sent to the departments and regional centres, well in advance before the commencement of examination.

#### **IV Course registration and Exam registration**

As soon as the admission process are over students are requested to login through the student portal, by entering id and password and do their course registration within one month. Those students who have done the course registration can only register for the end semester examinations.

The schedule for the end semester examinations are given 2-3 months before the commencement of examinations. Registration for examinations are done through online and hall tickets are generated to eligible candidates. The time table for examinations are published one month before the commencement of examination and all the above mentioned details are timely uploaded in the website of the University.

#### **V Condonation of shortage of attendance**

Attendance reports are uploaded before 5<sup>th</sup> of each month by the respective departments.



Those students who have shortage of attendance can apply for condonation of shortage of attendance, in the prescribed format before 15 days from the commencement of examinations.

## **VI Internal Assessment**

Internal Assessment, including seminars, test papers and assignments are done in a time bound manner, and the marks/ grades are published in the notice board in the departments. After all the redressal of grievances, the grades are forwarded to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor.

## **VII Feedback**

The students are directed to submit the feedback on courses offered, teachers and non teaching staff prior to the downloading of hall ticket. Only those students who have submitted the feedback will be able to download the hall ticket of end semester examination.

## **VIII Practical examinations**

The practical examinations are conducted before the theory examinations, according to the time table set by the respective departments.





## **IX Examination.**

The HOD/Director is the Chief Superintendent at each Dept./Centre during the conduct of University examination. The Additional Chief Superintendents are appointed and deputed to each Centre / Department from other Regional Centres / Departments , Main Center- Kalady by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. After all the examinations are over, University collections the answer scripts and hand over to the concerned examination sections for the conduct of centralized valuation camp.

## **X Evaluation**

Centralised valuation scheme is adopted by the university for speedy evaluation and publication of result. For U.G. programmes, single valuation is done and revaluation facility is given to students. For PG programmes, double valuation is done. The concerned Head of the Department or the senior most faculty suggested by the Head of the Department is the chairman of the valuation for each subject. Internal and External evaluators are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the panel of experts submitted by the Head of the Department.

## **XI Publication of result**

Results of UG and PG Programmes are published through online mode, subject to ratification by the Syndicate and Academic Council. No moderation is given for any of the UG, PG , Diploma programmes except BFA. After the publication of results mark lists are issued at the earliest and provisional certificates are distributed on request in the prescribed format. After the publication of results, UG students can apply for revaluation within one month. Results of revaluation are also published within the stipulated time period prescribed in the UG regulations.



## XII Grace Marks

Grace marks / grades are awarded to those students who perform exceptionally well and secure 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in the University youth festival and sports competitions. Separate guidelines are timely issued regarding the award of grades / points to NCC, NSS, Arts and Sports.

**Annual Report of the Examination Branch**

**2018-19**

Dr K S Ravikumar was the Pro Vice Chancellor of the University during 2018-19. The conduct of University Examinations & related administrative procedures, declaration of results and issuance of certificates were performed under the leadership of Dr K S Ravikumar. There are four sections under Examination branch-viz Examination A,B,C and D sections. The Members of Examination Branch meticulously worked for the smooth conduct of examination and publication of results on time even after the deluge that hit the State during August 2018. The University was the lone higher Education institution in the State which was severely affected by the massive flood causing damage more than 7 crore.

The Examination branch carried out the following functions during the Academic year 2018-19 .

**I Preparation of Exam Schedule**

As per the academic calendar 2018-19, the examination schedules for the odd and even semesters were prepared and notified on 05.10.2018 & 14.03.2019 respectively.

**II Question paper setting and printing**

As soon as the examination schedules are notified, three sets of question papers along with the answer keys in sealed covers are submitted to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor by the Heads of the Departments. Appointment of Question paper setters for BFA was made by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the respective panels submitted from the Departments and accordingly 3 sets of question papers are submitted to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor well in advance.



The question papers for the examinations are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor randomly from among the three sets of question papers submitted. The examination 'A' section makes arrangement for printing and packing of question papers confidentially under the supervision of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. Answer sheets with serial numbers are also sent to the departments and regional centres, well in advance before the commencement of examination.

### **III Course registration and Exam registration**

Admission to all PG courses are through entrance examination .As soon as the admissions are over students can login through the student portal, by entering id and password. Students should do the course registration within one month. Those who have done the course registration can only register for the end semester examinations.

The examination schedule for online registration for the end semester examination are given 2-3 months before the commencement of examinations. Registration for examination is online and hall tickets are generated to eligible candidates. The time table for examinations are published one month before the commencement of examination and all the above mentioned details are timely uploaded in the website of the University.

### **IV Condonation of shortage of attendance**

Attendance reports are uploaded before 5<sup>th</sup> of each month by the respective departments.

Those students who have shortage of attendance can apply for condonation of shortage of attendance, in the prescribed format before 15 days from the commencement of examinations.

80% attendance is compulsory for writing the PG examinations. Those who obtain 60 $\geq$ 80% of the total working days can condone their shortage of attendance with concrete evidence. For BA courses 75% attendance is compulsory. Those who obtain 55 $\geq$ 75% of total working





days can condone their shortage of attendance. For M.PEd 90% attendance is compulsory. And those who are within the limit of 70≥90% can condone.

#### **V Internal Assessment**

Internal Assessment, including seminars, test papers and assignments are done in a time bound manner, and the marks/ grades are published in the notice board of the respective departments. After all the grievances are redressed, the grades are forwarded to the office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor.

#### **VI Issuance of Hall Ticket and Collection of feedback**

The students are permitted to download the hall tickets by log in through student portal using their unique id and pass word, from two weeks prior to the examination. Only those students who have furnished feedback for the ongoing semester can download the hall tickets from the University website.

#### **VII Practical examinations**

The practical examinations are conducted before the theory examinations, according to the time table set by the respective departments. The external examiners are appointed by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the panel given by the concerned Heads of the Departments.

#### **VIII Examination.**

The respective HODs/Campus Directors are the Chief Superintendent at each Dept./Centre during the conduct of University examination and Additional Chief Superintendents are appointed and deputed to each Centre / Department from other Regional Centers / Departments , Main Center- Kalady by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor. After all the examinations are over, University will collect the answer scripts and hand over to the concerned examination sections for the conduct of



centralized valuation camp. During October 2018 & April 2019, the conduct of odd semester & even semester examination 19 faculty members were appointed as Additional Chief Superintendents.

## IX Evaluation

False numbers are stamped on the answer scripts to maintain secrecy. For U.G. programmes, single valuation is done and revaluation facility is given to students. For PG programmes, double valuation is done. The concerned Head of the Department or the senior most faculty suggested by the Head of the Department is the chairman of the valuation for each subject. Internal and External evaluators are selected by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor from the panel of experts submitted by the Head of the Department. The Section Officers of the respective examination section will be the Camp Officer during centralized valuation camp. The following staff were the Camp Officers during 2018-19 end semester examinations.

**Annual Report of the Examination Branch**

**2019-20**

The conduct of University Examinations for the year 2019-20 and its related administrative procedures, declaration of results and issuance of certificates were performed under the leadership of Dr K S Ravi Kumar, Pro Vice Chancellor of the University. Currently these exam related works are done under the four sections in Examination branch- viz Examination A,B,C and D sections. The highlight of examination Branch for the year 2019-20 is that the University introduced Outcome Based Teaching Learning Evaluation (OBTLE) for PG programmes from this academic year onwards and the evaluation softwares were designed accordingly. The University in tune with the examination calendar scheduled the conduct of examinations during April 2020. But the outbreak of Covid 19 pandemic forced the University to postpone the entire scheduled examinations.

The staff in Examination Branch had a very tough time while rescheduling the end semester examinations, observing the protocol of COVID 19 Pandemic that hit the world badly. Soon after the end of fourth lockdown period announced by the Government of India, the University scheduled the end semester examinations of UG and PG programmes during June 2020. As the jurisdiction of the University extends all over Kerala, the students who were pursuing studies in any of the campus (Main Campus, Kalady and 8 Regional Centres) were provided option to choose their own examination centres irrespective of their campus of study. This benefitted 100% of the students to appear for the examination in the campus nearest to their locality, observing the COVID 19 protocol and no COVID cases were reported.

The Examination branch carried out the following functions during the Academic year 2019-20

**I Preparation of Exam Schedule**

As per the academic calendar 2019-20, the UG and PG examination schedules for the odd semester was prepared and notified on 17.09.2019 and renotified on 11.10.2019. The PG and UG examinations commenced from 25.10.2019 & 29.10.2019 respectively. The even semester examination schedules were notified on 07.03.2020. But the outbreak of Covid 19 Pandemic compelled the University to renotify the final semester UG examinations on 28.05.2020 which commenced from 09.06.2020 and

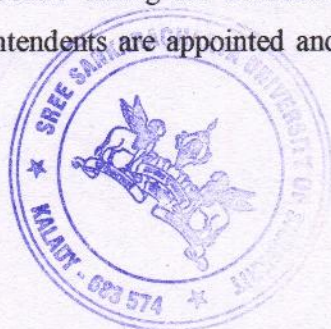

After all the examinations are over, University will collect the answer scripts and hand over to the concerned examination sections for the conduct of centralized valuation camp. During October 2019 & June 2020, the conduct of odd semester & even semester examination 19 faculty were appointed as Additional Chief Superintendents. The examinations were conducted observing the Covid protocol. All the examinations halls were disinfected prior to the students entry. The students were permitted to enter the examination halls after thermal screening and applying hand sanitizer. The invigilators and support staff were also provided gloves, face masks and sanitizers. The students with temperature variations and those from the containment zone were seated separately. Answer scripts of these students were specially packed.

The staff dealing with the answer scripts for evaluation took all the precautionary measures while unpacking and stamping false numbers on the answer scripts.
