General Introduction to Mohiniyattam

Programme Details - Introduction

Mohinyattam is one among the eight classical dance forms of India which has its origin in Kerala. This art form has a rich tradition and practice as a classical dance form. But the culture of this art form doesn't reach deep into the common people. As a traditional dance the awareness about Mohiniyattamin its form is very much necessary in the dance practitioners and art lovers of Kerala. In this context, Department of Mohiniyattam, Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit is introducing a Certificate Programme in Mohiniyattam which focus on the basics of Mohiniyattam.

Programme Objectives

The certificate course involves the integrated study of dance practices and dance theories. Students will be offered with the theory as well as on-stage performance skills through this course. The course is quite challenging and will interest students with a creative bend, those like to be in the limelight and love to perform on stage. The course offers conceptual knowledge, a thorough grounding in techniques and grammar, and of course, training in performance.

Scheme of examination

Papers in this programme is endorsed with 2 credits (1 for internal and 1 for external). The student with a minimum of 50 hour attendance will be eligible for appearing examination. The assessment will be based on the Nine Point Grading System. For course 1, the internal assessment will be based on the project work and the written exam. For course 2, the assessment will be practical based.
